### Important Club Update



Our club has obtained its nonprofit corporation status, so we will need to vote on new bylaws at the April 18, meeting, as well as approve the name change from the Marshall Area Garden Club to the new organization that will be known as the Marshall Area Garden Club, Inc. The new name will take effect June 1, 2017. We will also need to approve transferring the assets, which are primarily the bank accounts and the few other items in the storage shed, from the Marshall Area Garden Club to the Marshall Area Garden Club, Inc. Election of new officers will take place on May 16, with the new officers of the new corporation taking office as of our new fiscal year, which will be June 1, 2017.

We will be applying for a sales tax license as well as our tax-exempt status as of June 1, 2017. This change will require some reporting that we don't currently do, but we will work with the Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc. to do this properly over the next year. It will cost the club \$50 one time to acquire the tax-exempt status under the auspices of the Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc., and it will cost us \$20 each year to maintain our nonprofit corporate status with the state. We will be required to collect and remit sales tax on any items we actually sell, like the honey hoes. but we will be exempt from paying sales tax on items we purchase as soon as we acquire tax-exempt status. And we will be able to accept donations as a 501(c)(3) corporation as well as receive grants from other similar organizations.

Please let me know if you have any questions or need more info before the April vote. Thanks to everyone for their comments and input, and as I noted earlier, our bylaws will have to change very little, thanks to the work of the club over the past years.
